Here are items to consider: air compressor, 12 hour chemical lightstick, Tow Rope, 2FT Heavy Duty Jumper Cables, LED flashlight, (2) Batteries for flashlight, 5BC 2LB Fire Extinguisher, Mylar "Space" Blanket, Emergency Poncho with Hood, Personal Protection Equipment (Pair of Vinyl or Nitrile Gloves, Face Mask, Packet of Hand Sanitizer), Water Packets, Work Gloves, Emergency Whistle, Rolls of Duck Tape, Utility Knife, Distress Flag, Moist Towelettes, Reflective Triangle, First Aid Kits. Have warm clothes, coats and blankets in your vehicle. Never let your vehicle gas tank drop below half full. AND, don't forget your Cell Phone and charger. Yeah, I know, I sound like your father.
