Mini-Grants Now Available

The FY21 NCK HCC Budget was approved at the July meeting.

You may remember, that the budget includes 10 Mini Grants of \$4,722.80 each to be awarded to member healthcare providers to increase the capacity of the HCC members to prepare, plan or respond to an event within their region. The mini grant purchase will be identified in a Hazards Vulnerability Assessment completed by the NCK Region and the purchase will be tied to the identified gap or vulnerability.

An application will be completed for each mini-grant defining the hazard or gap, capability, regional benefit and inventory.

15 to 50 MCI Patient Surge: Hospital Implementation

This includes the rapid deployment of staff, supplies, and equipment to successfully activate and operate a mass casualty incident triage and treatment area.

- Keeping Our Communities Prepared for Health Emergencies
- 1. Attend three of the four regularly scheduled Coalition meetings per year in person, via conference call, webinar or by Designee. A designation letter must be provided to the NCK Readiness & Response Coordinator or Chair at least once per budget period or earlier if changes occur in designee appointment.
- 2. Participate in collaborative regional preparedness planning.
- 3. Participate in the development of surge capacity plans, inter-organizational agreements, and collaborative emergency response plans.
- 4. Contribute to meeting coalition priorities, goals, and contractual deliverables.
- 5. Work collaboratively with other members during regional emergencies and disasters.
- 6. Maintain upkeep and/or maintenance of Coalition and/or organizational resources that have been assigned, shared, or borrowed. Assigned, shared, or borrowed resources will be made available for contract verification purposes per federal and state grant guidelines.
- 7. Caucus Representatives are responsible to query and report to their membership regarding matters up for vote and the vote result, to include forwarding NCKHCC business to their caucus.
